For further study:

- Monday:** Read 1 Corinthians 4.1–2. Paul only offers one criteria for self-evaluation: faithfulness to God. How do you typically evaluate your life? By your faithfulness or some other measure?
- Tuesday:** Read 1 Corinthians 4.3–5. How would your sense of self change if you were to take Paul's approach to receiving criticism?
- Wednesday:** Read 1 Corinthians 4.6–7. What have you received that you tend to take credit for? How does remembering that all you have is a gift change your perspective about your life and how you view other people?
- Thursday:** Read 1 Corinthians 4.8–13. What is your perspective on suffering? Do you expect life to be hard at times? When life has been a struggle, how have you seen God in the midst of the struggle?
- Friday:** Read 2 Corinthians 6.3–10. How does Paul's perspective challenge your own about the nature of suffering?
- Saturday:** Read Revelation 3.17. Jesus' warning to the church at Laodicea is reminiscent of Paul's warning to the Corinthian believers: you think you're morally and spiritually mature, but you're not! What can we do as believers to have our blind spots revealed?
